Conducting the intake survey with interviews

Dear Friends,

Thank you for making a difference to women and children in Meru county, Kenya. This year we expanded our women’s community program to include more than 5,000 mothers in 3 counties. Although our women’s program began as a COVID pivot, it continues today to be integral to our mission to strengthen school communities. After all, worldwide, mothers are key members of any school community.

This year we conducted an extensive intake survey with women in our garden program. Almost all mothers shared that their children do not attend school when their harvests are poor because it’s prohibitive to pay for a school uniform or other supplies. Likewise, 100% affirmed that a school meal program is important with an additional 1 out of 5 mothers stating that they would have their children walk even further to attend a school that served a meal.

FY 2020–21

- Completed a deworming program for 1,000 school children.
- Harvested 142,000+ pounds of nutritious vegetables and fruits from school farms to boost school meals.
- Stocked and maintained 8 school fishponds to feed fish weekly to 900+ children for an additional source of protein.
- Installed 1 solar borehole pump for access to clean water for 3,000 women participating in our community garden program.
- Provided seeds, skills and other inputs to 5,000+ women from 3 counties in rural Kenya to grow vegetables at their homes to help feed their families.

Home Grown School Meals




